It has been a very exciting week for Destiny Church Davao.

The team of business professionals, entrepre-neurs and missionaries from Inter-national Christian Mission (ICM) Singapore were invited to conduct a three-day Bible School training course for leaders, entitled *Bible School In a Bag* (BSIB), as well as a two-day conference for professionals in the marketplace called the *Marketplace Crossover* *Conference*. This took place on August 7-9 and 10-11 2018 respectively.

The BSIB was attended by a total of 72 trainers, pastors, ministry heads and life group leaders not just from Destiny Davao, but also from different churches and organizations as well in the Davao Region. The training is an equipping course on fundamentals of Christian life, Church planting and Church growth.

Nepal milestone – new Timothy Centre building

Since Dieu responded to God's calling to work in Nepal, we have been overwhelmed in witnessing what God has done in the nation. More than 1,000 Timothys (church planters) were trained by Pastor Nehemiah and team, with our participation. Several hundreds of churches have been planted and God is adding to the number by His Grace.

During the many years working with Pastor Nehemiah and team, we were blessed to witness many breakthroughs. He surprised us with a new church building within months, and a training centre another few months later, all built during the early years of our Nepal ministry.

As the ministry grew, we were flooded with wonderful reports of successes in remote areas of Nepal. Many churches were planted by our Timothys, and many signs and wonders showing us God is truly in charge and He is blessing Nepal.

Christian population grew from 0.1% in 2001 to an estimated 3.5% a couple of years ago. We were truly blessed to be witnesses of this great works of our God! All praise to His Name!

In 2013, we felt the need to have a more permanent place to train our Timothys and provide proper dormitories for them. Some of them had travelled for three days to get to the training centre. After discussion and prayers, God allowed us to purchase a piece of land of 1000 sq.ft. next to Nehemiah's training centre.

We did not start the building works as we felt the timing was not right. We used the years to plan for the project instead. Proper consultants were engaged to prepare the

building plans for submission to Government authorities.

Finally, construction works began early 2017 after winter. Our Nepal brethren decided to build a 4-storey building with the first 3 floors designated to be the Timothy training centre.

The new building will provide much needed living quarters for our visiting Timothys. The second floor is purpose-built to house the men and the third storey for the ladies. Both floors will have bathrooms and toilets. The ground floor is a reasonable size classroom/conference facility for up to 100 people (sitting space).

The project faced several obstacles. Funds was lacking, and we had to stop construction late last year. In mid-2017, we experienced a rare flooding of the river that damaged our training room, kitchen and part of the church office.

Thank God the church was able to

raise funds to repair the damage. Then, there was a Government project to widen the river by the side of training centre. This would cut into part of our land.

The church had appealed to the Government to divert the river and avoid cutting into its compound. As we wait for the outcome of the appeal, we are grateful that God blessed us with fresh funds this year.

The Timothy Centre should be completed by October this year. We are excited to attend the opening/ consecration of the Centre when we visit Nepal early October.

Train the trainers – June / July 2018 in Singapore

Crash course! Eighteen hours held over six Tuesdays that usually takes 40 days. The Church Planting Institute (CPI) Training Program, also known as Bible School in a Briefcase / Bag, has been a highly effective tool in the training of church planters especially in the rural places - villages, towns, mountainous areas. Many church planters have been trained and over a thousand churches have been planted in Cambodia, Philippines, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Vietnam, et cetera.

Insights into the road less traveled – Central Asia

My friend PC in ICM has often mentioned his trips to Central Asia and unbeknownst to me, a ministry connection was made 8 years ago. "The stan?" Where on earth is this place, I didn't even know it existed in the world map until I ventured into the unknown.

My opportunity to travel there with the team from ICM finally came this May and after 2 weeks of travelling and mingling with the people there, I came home with experiences and memories which will last a lifetime.

My previous similar trips were all outreach rallies with altar calls and me praying for random people who attended those rallies in droves.

This trip with the ICM team

pleasantly surprised me with a euphoric experience.

The beautiful countries in Central Asia with scenery that could only come from the heavens. And the people were the kindest, the warmest and the most hospitable I have ever met.

Let me start by stating that I was not given any mandate for this trip, just pure observation and learning the ropes of the 'trade' so to speak.

I witnessed the desire of the local shepherds and leaders for learning and soaking in everything that was imparted by our team and their intense need for prayers and encouragement. The team ministered with God's word, prayers and prophesies as the Spirit led. This was much to their delight and spiritual uplift.

The highlight of the trip was traveling out of the capital city into the countryside and into lesser known towns and villages, to seek out and visit like-minded friends. It reminded me of St Paul's journey.

Along the journey, we met several local shepherds in their homes and communities. They told us stories of trials and hostilities they have to face from within their community; we heard first-hand testimonies of adversity and hardship that they endured.

One of them was even tied to a horse and dragged on the ground. He miraculously survived the ordeal and lived to testify God's goodness

There was also controversy over burial grounds. In some communities, believers were denied burying the dead in public cemeteries. Bodies were dug up overnight after burial. Thankfully, the issue was eventually resolved when the state decided to allocate a separate burial ground for believers.

We visited one such cemetery where a young believer was buried. He died one evening in winter when he was lost in a fog while rounding up his herd of cattle for the night.

These were heart-wrenching stories.

Yet, in all these trials and tribulations, these brethren remain faithful to the call to witness in 'Judea and Samaria'. My brother called it "incarnational" witnessing. They wept while interceding for the lost. That's their zeal and passion.

In one city, we joined the local

shepherds up on the mountains to pray over the city: Your Kingdom come!

We were often invited to their homes for fellowship meals.

I was overwhelmed by the simplicity of life and the generosity and hospitality of these folks. How could these people with so little give so much? That could only come from the love they receive from God. I was ministered to and to think that I was going there to minister to them. these shepherds are Indeed. 'faithful servants' of God in their own ways.

I'm reminded of the Lord's saying "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into his harvest field." Indeed, there are brethrens out there who risked their lives, 'sacrificed' the comfort of urban living to work in the field. The question I asked of myself: "Is this the beginning or end of the road?"
