They were amazed as the revelation was exactly what was in their hearts and mind. It was no mere coincidence but a divine appointment!

## BIBLE SCHOOL IN A BAG Training in Baguio, Philippines

I am a bi-vocational missionary with my church, Covenant Evangelical Free Church and have been serving under the Urban Missions Thrust since 2012. I had the wonderful privilege to join ICM Singapore for the 'Bible School in a Bag' Training in Baguio. As I reflected on this journey, my heart simply welled up with gratitude to God for His divine leading.

It began with a prayer asking God whether it was time for me to move on to other regions after 6 years of my missions focus on the Philippines. Then I had a dream and saw a diary and a map of the Philippines with her 3 regions – Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao. While seeking God, I was impressed by I Kings 19:15 - "Go back the same way you came …" and immediately 'Baguio' came to mind. The Lord confirmed it at the ICM Luncheon when I heard that in 2020 they will be focusing on the Philippines, and their next BSIB training was to Baguio and Davao! So it was clear to me that the diary was pointing me back to where the Lord had first led me to, the Philippines; the map unmistakably a confirmation for me to continue His work there.

So, to Baguio I went with the ICM Team for the purpose to share Steady Readers Missions (SRM), a literacy outreach programme of my church. I'm grateful to the Kingdom-minded team who accorded me the air time to present at their already tight schedule. It was fruitful, and within a short time it seemed I was on the way to a divine partnership in Baguio!

Apart from seeing the amazing hand of God's leading, I was blessed beyond my expectation. Just to sit at the feet and learn from God's faithful servants who tirelessly shared modules after modules of Biblical truths and principles; coupling with the conviction of their testimonies, this trip had turned out to be truly an inspiring retreat for me. Finally, before we left for the airport, I was led to a personal ministry time by the team; a childhood issue over the deaths of my parents was addressed and released to the Lord... an unexpected divine moment to wrap up this mission trip.

Being in the same church and occasional fellowship group with Dieu ES, I had heard from him about ICMS's work in training and supporting church plant workers in Asia. Having retired from work earlier this year, I decided to take up Dieu's invitation to join an ICMS trip which happened to be, at this time of the year, to Davao & Panabo.

Our group of 8 was split into 2 teams - 4 to conduct BSIB training in Davao City, and 4 to Panabo to do the CPI leadership training. I was part of the Panabo team and assigned to do 2 lessons.

The camaraderie of the Singapore team was palpable. We gathered at the start of each morning for worship, devotion and prayer before heading for breakfast. At one of these devotion sessions, I was particularly struck by Grace's sharing of her vision of "Philippines" appearing to her as "Philiddines" and how when she obeyed God's instruction to turn the 2 d's down to become p's, streams of living waters were released to the people. So that's the calling for why we were there, to humbly do our part for the greater body of Christ.

The 25 or so Filipino brothers and sisters who came for the training in Panabo were very eager learners. I did feel that the program of 12 sessions in 3 days was quite a lot to absorb, but I do understand the constraints of time and availability of both trainers and trainees. So it was good that half the training sessions were conducted by the local Panabo pastors, who would be able to help the trainees with follow-up and revision. Our "reward" was the delicious food during the lunch breaks, especially Ps Erene's very own curry chicken. The third and final day ended with prayer ministry time for the trainees. A mini-highlight of the trip was during the monthly "Acoustic Night Life" outreach event at Destiny Church Davao on 16 Oct evening. As Ps Carlo was speaking, at around 7:40pm, the floor started to move, the loudspeakers that were hanging down from the ceiling and stage decorations started swaying. Some of the people in the audience ran out of the building to the open carpark. It was my first experience of a strong earthquake! Some minutes later and with the assistance of Mr Google, we learned that it was a 6.3 temblor with its epi-centre about 80 km southwest of Davao City. The cool Ps Carlo paused just a short while, then resumed his message to the crowd.

From this first trip with ICMS, I am very inspired by the work ICMS is doing in obedience to our Lord Jesus' call in Luke 10:2 "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few...". God willing, I will come on more such trips with ICMS.

## ICM PHILIPPINES Inaugural Train the Trainers at Baguio

A Journey of Divine Appointments aptly describes the year 2015 leading up to the launching of ICM Philippines Foundation Inc. in October 2019 and I believe will continue to be so in the years to come.

It all started in 2015 as a personal mission in response to God's challenge to do something to help the ministry of underprivileged pastors. In a vision where God showed me the difficulty of HIS servants in breaking hard ground, The Lord asked me "What can you do?" To this I told God, Why are you asking me? I am just me, I am not a pastor or a church leader and I do not know what to do! But the question lingered in my spirit and I simply offered my 2 fish and 5 loaves and the Lord took over. It is in this context that I met ICMS in their outreach in Davao and in meeting them, the Lord provided exactly what the pastors in the Philippines needed for their work in the harvest field- it was the ICMS outreach material which is officially called CPI/Bible School in a Briefcase but which I fondly renamed BIBLE SCHOOL IN A BAG.



The challenge was given to me in February 2015 in Puerto Princesa City in Palawan. I was a guest speaker in the God Bless Israel conference hosted by Grafted-In International Ministries. Come April 2015, I met ICMS in Davao City and 3 months later, together with ICMS, we flew to Palawan and ICMS conducted the 3 day Training the Trainers attended by about 40 pastors. The next two years, together with two other ladies, we conducted Trainer Trainings in Batangas and Pangasinan. During these 3 years, I have been a regular attendee in the ICMS outreach in Davao, grateful for the opportunity to remain in touch with my dearest brethren from ICMS. On certain occasions. I connected other churches in Davao to ICMS and have likewise brought some friends to experience "Short term Missions". Being a businessperson, my concept of missions is that it is something only pastors and missionaries do.

Ordinary people like me are just church attendees and at best cell group leaders. I did not know business people could be missionaries as well. In 2017, Bro Wilson Teh of ICMS asked me to consider engaging members of the weekly bible study group I am attending to take part in the BSIB (Bible School in a bag) outreach. So I did invite them to join me in Palawan and Davao. However, in 2018, Bro Willian Ng asked me if I would consider formally organizing a group that would become the Philippine version of ICMS. I hesitated because I knew this would be a huge responsibility. I was afraid for many reasons so I pondered and prayed about it. I told the Lord my 3 major fears: I do not know what to do because I neither have the skill nor the experience; I do not have time unless my husband approves (because I am the VP for finance and administration in our companies); and I do not have the resources to sustain the ministry long

term. I told God if He will answer all my concerns, I will have the confidence to push through because I know it is His will and not mine. Amazing things began to happen. To my fear of lack of experience and ability, ICMS assured me that they will run along side me, teach, guide and support me in any way they can- much like a big brother; to my fear of time and availability, my husband gave his approval and support for me to lead the ministry; and lastly to my fear of financial sustainability, the Lord sent someone who gave me a 7-figure check specifically for the ministry and coincidentally is the amount required by Philippine law to set-up a foundation. And so I told Bro William, OK, I will accept the responsibility because God made it clear that He is more than able and this is His will. So what better name for the Philippine organization but to name it after our big brother- and thus came ICM Philippines Foundation Inc.

In interview with Dr. Erwin Lutzer, originally published in the wake of the 2011 Japan earthquake and tsunami, the pastor and author asked: Where is God in Natural Disasters? Dr Lutzer says, it was Martin Luther who said, "When you look around and wonder whether God cares, you must always hurry to the cross and you must see Him there."

When we hear about a natural disaster we should grieve with those who grieve. And we should ask what we can do to alleviate their suffering.

Open door opportunities to share the pure Gospel through the Child Friendly Space approach and relief distribution in order to debrief and ease the earthquake victims. The trauma and the stress due to several earthquakes with a magnitude of more than intensity 6 troubled the residences in the Davao Region and Cotabato areas. They don't have safe drinking water and markets are closed due to the damages of building structures.

CPI volunteers went to the area to assist the impact and need was terrible. You cannot hold your tears because of the pitiful condition the people experiencing especially the children. No water to drink and no food to eat. People are asking for help.

Praise God! He has given as the opportunity to respond in times of calamities like this. Thank you for the prayers and encouragement.

15 of us went as a team to Cambodia and Vietnam from 5 Dec to 11 Dec. It was my first time having a look at the mission field in these countries.

As we were heading out to GTIS after touching down in Cambodia, many stories were shared by the people who visited GTIS over the past years. One of the stories was about how education in Cambodia still has got a lot of improvements to be made where some kids are not even able to afford education or have proper learning opportunities in schools. It was exciting to hear how GTIS has made a positive impact at Kampong Speu. Kids were able to learn and put their learning into action such as conversing in English. This has showed me that education is indeed a privilege and an opportunity to create a greater impact for the future of Cambodia where leaders of values can be raised up for the nation.

Personally I was very encouraged to have finally seen GTIS for myself. The entire experience was very surreal especially after having heard and seen many photos of it. Seeing the school structure, the kids, the teachers, etc -I could only thank God for the work that has begun at GTIS and for the people who have faithfully sown into it. We had a look at Edelweiss Hub across GTIS as well. Even though this started not long ago, it was still amazing to me that we are now reaching out to younger kids and, growing them from a young age to be a person of good character and values.

My prayer would be for both GTIS & Edelweiss Hub to bear fruits for the Kingdom of God which would last for eternity.

I would definitely recommend anyone who has heard about GTIS to go and have a look at the school for yourself. It will be an eye-opening experience as you walk through the grounds of GTIS and see what God is doing in the nation of Cambodia.

After the time spent at Cambodia, we travelled across the border to Vietnam. It was heartening to see a young

church with such a vibrant community for God. Their vision for people to be transformed inside out by Christ and to portray to the world what it really means to be a true Christian is inspiring. I pray that God's presence will continue to move amongst the hearts of the people in this young church and for them to bring even more people into the Kingdom of Light as they boldly proclaim God's love and truth.

All in all, this mission trip has been memorable and am grateful to God for such an opportunity to be able to see God's heart in these places.

What I took away from the Cambodia trip was that it was really inspiring to see the children able to study and play together, not bothered by their backgrounds. It's also very refreshing to see how they are all so hungry and eager for learning unlike in Singapore where that kind of attitude is honestly quite rare. I'm just very happy to see them filled with such joy and hope even though they may have lesser than I do. I'm also quite excited to see how the expansion of the school will turn out to be.

In Vietnam though, I was reminded of how God is everywhere. Even though I was born in a Christian family, I feel like I'm only just starting to understand what it really means to be a Christian and accepting that this journey is not easy. I was really encouraged by the way the Vietnamese worshipped, like their lives depended on it and it just reflects their faith and hunger for God. I was also really impressed with the technology they used for worship, one keyboard can do a lot of magic, and the programme they use to project the lyrics is the same as the one we use for youth Gen back home. I think I've been too shielded for Ive never thought that Vietnam would be so advanced

All in all, I just have this one thought: God has big plans, and He wants me to be part of it.

I really learned a lot and enjoyed myself during the trip.

Indeed, when I sat in 2 of the English classes, I saw how students learnt to use the language through games and group work. The smiles and laughter in these classrooms certainly testify to the fun and engaging lessons. I was further blown away when a grade 9 student interpreted for the speaker during the youth meeting at Edelweiss. It is no mean feat to be speaking in a non-native language, let alone interpreting it with such fluency. Praise the Lord for the teachers and students in GTIS!
